MATH 2, <u>GEOMETRY</u>, FALL 1997, KRCC, 3 UNITS, TTh 12:30 pm - 1:45 pm IN FE-12, SCHEDULE #1097, MR. PAUL T. KRYDER

Objective of Course: To help you become proficient in the basic concepts and techniques of Euclidian geometry, and to help prepare you for trigonometry and all other courses which have geometry as prerequisite.

Prerequisite: Math 1 (Elementary Algebra) or equivalent with grade of A, B, or C.

Final Exam: Monday, December 15, 1 pm - 3 pm, FE-12. (The last "regular" day of class is Thursday, December 11.)

Required Text: Discovering Geometry: An Inductive Approach by Michael Serra, 2nd edition, 1997. Please bring your textbook to every class session. A ruler, a protractor, and a compass (please get a good one, not a cheap one) will also be required; please bring these to every class session. A scientific calculator may be required; I will let you know if and when. Graph paper will be required later in the semester. (I do NOT loan out materials to students who fail to bring theirs to class.)

We will have **5 to 7 "chapter" exams-**-depending on how far we progress in the text-plus a **comprehensive final exam**. Since this is the first time I have used this textbook, I cannot tell you at this point what chapters and sections will be included on each exam. I plan, however, to proceed in the textbook in order, skipping some sections and perhaps even certain whole chapters.

Cheating on any exam or quiz will result in a <u>counting</u> score of 0 on that exam or quiz or, in very serious cases, a grade of F for the class.

Attendance expected but not explicitly part of your grade. If you stop attending, do NOT expect me to drop you. (Although I reserve the right to, to make room for students wishing to add.) If a personal situation arises that will cause you to miss more than three days of class in a row (or more than one day for a class that meets only twice a week), PLEASE contact me as soon as possible to make arrangements to keep up with the class.

Outside help: In addition to (perhaps) seeing me during my office hours, there is free tutoring available to all KRCC students at the Tutorial Center, HE-58.

Special arrangements for students with disabilities can be made by discussing the situation with me privately (and perhaps working with the Disabled Student Services Office on campus); you may of course depend on my absolute discretion in such matters. (Students who take exams in the DSS office must take them <u>at or before</u> the time the class takes their exams, NOT after.)

Homework and homework policies given in Homework List. Quizzes short (i.e. 5-10 minutes) and usually unannounced ahead of time. (Homework and quizzes used to "enhance" chapter exam scores.) Each chapter exam announced at least 3 calendar days in advance. New, large blue book required for each exam (get in bookstore for a few cents). I deal exclusively with points—not letter grades—until the end of the semester, at which time letter grades will be assigned on the following scale, after dropping each student's lowest exam score (each exam has 100 points "possible"): F < 60% ≤ D < 68% ≤ C < 80% ≤ B < 90% ≤ A. (For the Midterm Reporting Date, 10-17-97, your "grade" will be determined by applying the aforementioned scale to your sum total of points from the exam graded to that date, without dropping your lowest exam score.) I never give incompletes except in the most extreme, unusual circumstances (verified, of course); also, anyone who takes an incomplete will NOT receive an "A" in the class (that is, if you earn an A I will give you a B; if you earn a B or lower you will get the grade you earn).

Early/Late Exams: Early exam okay with <u>very</u> good excuse. [Harder] late exam only if (1) you missed a previous exam, AND (2) you have an excuse verified by an impartial party (e.g. a doctor or a court clerk.) Quizzes <u>never</u> given early or late for any reason.

Messages for me may be left at my campus mailbox. In a pinch, you may phone me at home (Reedley listed number). Please understand that I <u>never</u> give out information on individual grades over the telephone to anyone, at any time.

Several No-Nos: NO babies or small children in class ever, NO distractive behavior of any kind ever, NO "I had to work" excuse ever, NO pagers or portable phones ringing during class ever, and NO vehicle alarms disrupting class ever.
