MATH 20, SCIENTIFIC AND TECHNICAL CALCULATIONS, FALL 1997, KRCC, 1 UNIT, TTh 9:30 am - 10:45 am (08-19 thru 09-25) IN PS-75, SCHEDULE #1116, MR. PAUL T. KRYDER

**Objective of Course:** Math 20 is a 6-week course designed to teach the student how to do the basic mathematics necessary for science classes, particularly chemistry. Use of the scientific calculator will be emphasized throughout the duration of the class.

Prerequisite: Math 54 (Arithmetic) or equivalent; Math 1 desirable.

**Required Text:** Chemical Calculations, Series B by George Sackheim, 1996. (We will cover all of Chapters 1 and 2 and then see what we have time for after that.) Please bring your textbook to every class session. A **scientific calculator** will be required starting on the second class day; please bring your calculator to class every class session.

This class is graded **CR-NC only**; to get a CR you must essentially get 75% of the points. We will have three 100-point **exams** (one about every two weeks), so to get CR you must get 225 out of 300 points (75%) AND no lower than 50 on the third exam. A new, large <u>blue book</u> (get in bookstore for a few cents) will be required for each exam. **Quizzes** and **homework** will be used to "enhance" exam scores. (Quizzes are never given early or late for any reason, and homework is never accepted late for any reason.) **Early exam** okay with <u>very</u> good excuse. [Harder] late exam only in extreme, serious circumstances (verified by an impartial party such as a physician or a judge). **Cheating** on any exam or quiz may result in a score of "0" on that exam or quiz or, in very serious cases, dismissal from the class. **NO incompletes** will be given in this class for any reason.

This class meets <u>every</u> Tuesday and Thursday for its duration; there are <u>no holidays</u> which conflict with this class. There are 12 class meetings. **Attendance** is expected but not an explicit part of your grade.
