Rewritten papers will be due no later than one week after they are returned. Students not present with a rough draft during the peer review period will receive a 10% penalty on both their final draft and rewrite.

Quizzes/Homework: Quizzes will be given to ensure that you keep up with the assigned readings. These quizzes cannot be made up. In addition, homework assignments dealing with writing and the technical aspects of writing will be given.

Class Participation: You will have many opportunities to interact with each other as well as with the instructor. Active participation in all class activities will be a part of your grade.
