Grading

Your final grade will be based on six elements: homework, focus activities, chapter exams, attendance, oral exams and the final exam.

When assigned, homework is due the next day at the beginning of ତୀଶଛଞ୍ଚ You may miss up to three homework assignments without penalty. (e.g. sick days) After each chapter, we will have an exam. The idea is to give lots of small exams, not just 3-4 major tests. The final is not comprehensive, it covers only chapter 4,5 and 6. Since the enphasis of this class is on development of oral abilities in Spanish, you must be in class to acquire those skills. You can only have two absences. Every subsequent absence will deduct two full letter grades from your oral participation, which is 10 % of your final grade.

GRADING:

There will be seven exams. The exams will be almost every Tuesday, and any exam may be taken only once. "NO MAKE UP EXAMS" But if you come to the last 3 weeks of class from April 21 to May 14, you will get extra credit, I will drop your lowest exam. During these threee weeks, I will cover chapter 4, 5 and 6, which will be on the final. By coming every day during these three weeks, you will be ready for the final, and also, by droping your lowest exam, your percentage will go up.

SYLLABUS

Spanish 1 A Course Description (Catalog)

First semester course in conversational and written Spanish. Spanish 1A, Beginning Spanish, 4 units. Pronunciation, conversation, reading, and writing.

Spanish 1 A Course Description (For this particular section)

This course stresses communication skillis in Spanish. Much of the practice work will be done in pairs. The goal is for beginning students to acquire minimal conversational ability in Spanish. By the end of the semester you will have studied commands, you will be able to describe people, places, and your favorite activities, you will also be able to communicate in Spanish using basic Spanish, and describe your goals among other things. In the process, you will learn certain cultural details. For example, you will learn under what circumstances actual commands are used and various kinds of "softer" structures.

It is assumed that you are in this class because you want to learn how to communicate in Spanish. You will not have developed that ability completely by the end of the semester, but you will be surprised at how many communicative skills you will have acquired!

Specific course goals and objectives

1.-To develop your "survival" language skills.

2.-To develop a sensitivity to differences and similarities in cultural issues.

3.-By the end of the semester, you will be able to:

- a.-When shown a drawing of several actions, describe what happens using the appropriate tense.
- b.-Discuss experiences, plans, actions in the past, and other topics using appropriate vocabulary.
- c.-Engage in certain "situations": greet people, express your likes and dislikes, ask for time, introductions etc.
- d.-Describe hypothethical or imaginary situations.

Method of instruction.

Every effort will be made to make this class student-centered. That is, an activity will be modeled, then you will work in pairs and small groups to assimilate the vocabulary and structures under consideration. You should make every effort to speak only Spanish and to prepare in advance for classroom learning activities.
