#### **Course Description:**

To be eligable for Drawing I, a student need not have any drawing experience. This course is a beginning drawing course designed to introduce students to the historical, contemporary, and technical study of drawing techniques. Included in this course are exercises, extended drawings, class-room drawings, homework drawings, written assignments, class lectures, class discussions, and individual and group critiques. Both traditional and experimental approaches to drawing will be explored throughout the semester study.

# **Course Objectives:**

- 1. To develop intermediate level drawing skills and competency.
- 2. To inform students of historical and contemporary drawing techniques.
- 3. To develop the student's ability to evaluate his or her own work as well as the works of others.
