COURSE DESCRIPTION:

A survey of the political, social, economic, cultural and intellectual developments of European civilization from its prehistoric antecedents in the Middle East to the rise of modern European nations in the seventeenth century.

COURSE EXPECTATIONS AND ASSIGNMENTS:

The overall course grade depends on the components outlined below. A point system will be used to calculate each student's grade for the semester.

- * Exams: There will be four exams covering assigned readings and course lectures. Each exam is worth 100 points. The lowest grade will be dropped. If you miss an exam it will become a 0. There are no make-up exams.
- * Research Paper: Each student will complete a minimum 2,000 word research paper, the subject of which must be approved by the instructor first. Please see attached papers for more details. The paper will be worth 300 points.
- * Video Notes: For this class, students will take notes on each video watched within the class. Each video note will have at least one paragraph of information detailing what was seen and learned from the video. Each video will be written on a separate piece of paper. The video notes will be worth a total of 50 points.
- * Final: This will be a cumulative exam of everything learned during the course of this class. The Final will be worth 250 points. If you miss the final exam it will become a 0. It will not be possible to pass the course without this grade.

ATTENDANCE:
