Course Objective: Philosophy 2 is a course in critical thinking It is evident, therefore, that in the course of this semester you will be asked to do some thinking of your own and to do it carefully, reflectively and with self-awareness. Using the Quinn book as assigned, you will encounter a wide summation of human experience and, in cases, some of the great minds in human culture. You will benefit markedly from such contact. A course objective is to assist you to build on and improve your writing skills. You will learn how to write with cogency and clariy, how to target your writing to specific audiences and how to keep good logic on your side as you engage in persuasive communication:

Course Requirements: You are required to do the reading as assigned. I may resort to an occasional snap quiz to be sure there is no neglect of this assignment. Poor work in this regard will be subtracted from your next assignment's grade. There will be three writing assignments of six pages each. Each of these writing assignments represents 15% of your grade. An exam on logic is also 15% of your grade. Participation in class discussion is another 10% of the grade. The final exam contributes 25% of the grade for the course. Brief writing assignments from time to time comprise the final 5%.

Grading: The curve method of grading is not used. You may earn an "A" grade (or any other grade) by competing against a standard rather than against your peers.
