4. Extra Credit

A 10 to 15 minute presentation on some aspect of art, or a presentation on a piece of your own art (agreed upon by the instructor) with a maximum of two presentations per student. Originality of thought and opinion will be important.

5. Grading

Class participation is a major part of the learning experience. All students must participate in class discussions. Grading will be based on; exams 20 % each, papers 10 % each and extra credit 2.5% each possible. If you have any unexcused absences, late projects will not be accepted.

6. Various Policies

Campus code requires shoes or sandals and a shirt be worn at all times. No eating, drinking, or smoking, cell-phones or beepers, are allowed in the classroom. No children and/or pets will be allowed to "sit in". A student must complete the entire course (including the final) in order to receive a passing grade.
