COURSE OBJECTIVES: To improve your proficiency, both in speed and in accuracy, in using a keyboard.

REQUIRED TEXT: Skillbuilding: Building Speed and Accuracy on the Keyboard, Second Edition; Hoffman Eide, Carole, Andrea Holmes Rieck, V. Wayne Klemin; Glencoe/McGraw-Hill, New York, 1996.

ATTENDANCE: Students are expected to attend all class meetings, be on time, and be in class the entire class session. ATTENDANCE GRADE: Each student will begin the semester with 24 attendance points. Each absence will result in the loss of four (4) attendance points. If you are absent more than six (6) times, you will continue to lose four points per absence, but now these points will be taken from other earned points, such as homework and tests.

TARDIES: Students are expected to be on time. It is distracting, rude and unfair to fellow classmates and to the instructor when a student is late. Two tardies will be counted as an absence, and each tardy will result in a loss of two (2) attendance points.

FINAL EXAM: A final timed keyboarding test worth 1 test will be given at the end of the quarter. The final test will replace 1 missed test (if any) and will determine your final Improvement Grade.

Students are required to practice speed and accuracy on the keyboard throughout the class period. You may not study for another class or read a book during class.
