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Technical Notes

You will note that most demographic trends in this book include six academic years, Fall 2002 - Spring 2009. All demographic data is based on graded students. Specifically, we count students who receive a mark on their official transcript of: A, B, C, D, F, P (formerly CR), NP (formerly NC), I or W. If a student is enrolled at more than one campus they are included in the demographics of each location. Therefore, counts are "unduplicated" by location, but "duplicated" across the district.

In the narrative sections, references to change over time pertain to percentages rather than to raw numbers. This is appropriate since the base population has typically risen and fallen over the period of analysis, and the total population is so varied across locations. Percentages therefore provide us with a reasonable method of comparison.

All student data reported in this book, with the exception of transfers has been obtained from the file that generates the official transcript. Other data sources will be referenced as appropriate. All data are "cleaned"* and analyzed.

Percentages may not total 100% due to independent rounding.

These data may not exactly match data coming from the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office MIS database due to different methods of data collection, file specifications and standards of accuracy.

From this point forward, State Center Community College District will be referred to as SCCCD.

*Cleaning data refers to the process of filtering out/correcting flawed records and creating categories for descriptive data.

Chapter 1

Student, Faculty & Enrollment Trends

This chapter of the Fact Book profiles the SCCC student body. All demographic data are self-reported on the admission application. All enrollment data are calculated in the Datatel system.

Faculty demographics are also provided including ethnicity, gender, and age.

Please note “North Centers Combined” represents Willow International/Clovis Center, Madera Center, and Oakhurst Center data combined. These centers are also listed individually.

SCCCD Enrollment Trends

Figure I.1 summarizes headcount enrollment for five years, beginning with the fall 2004 term and ending with spring 2009. Enrollment growth is charted indicating the percent each site contributes to the State Center Community College District (SCCCD) as a whole. **Figure I.2** displays SCCC D growth (unduplicated) for ten semesters. Enrollment increased 16.8% for the District from fall 2004 to fall 2008.

Enrollment Trends (duplicated across locations)




Student Educational Goals

Figure I.3 summarizes self-reported student educational goals as indicated on the admission application. The percentage of students with the intent of earning an AA/AS degree, with or without going on for a BA/BS, has increased 12% from fall 2005 to fall 2008. While "undecided" was the goal indicated by the majority of students in past years, students indicating a goal of "undecided" have decreased 10% from fall 2005 to fall 2008.



SCCCD FTES by College & Center (Number)



SCCCD FTES by College & Centers (Percentage)



Fresno City College: Student Enrollment Status



Reedley College: Student Enrollment Status




Willow International/Clovis Center: Student Enrollment Status



Madera Center: Student Enrollment Status




Student Financial Aid Status

According to **Figure I.13**, the percentage of SCCC students awarded financial aid increased 2% from fall 2006 to fall 2008. These students completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and were awarded aid; however, they may not have collected the award. This includes all award types, the majority being Board of Governor's Grant (BOGG) and Federal PELL grants.

Financial Aid Recipients (percentage)




Student Ethnicity

Figures I.15 - I.21 summarize the ethnic diversity of SCCC students. While the percentage of "unknown" and white students decreased from fall 2004 to fall 2008, the Hispanic population has increased overall at SCCC (Figure I.15). Reedley College consistently serves the largest percentage of Hispanic students; however, from fall 2004 to fall 2008 the percentage of Hispanic students decreased slightly while the Asian population increased (Figure I.17). Fresno City College serves the largest percentage of African-American/non-Hispanic (8%) and Asian/Pacific Islander (15%) students (Figure I.16), while Oakhurst Center serves the largest percentage of White/non-Hispanic students (70%) (Figure I.21).

SCCC: Student Ethnic Distribution



Fresno City College: Student Ethnic Distribution



Reedley College: Student Ethnic Distribution




Willow International/Clovis Center: Student Ethnic Distribution



Madera Center: Student Ethnic Distribution




Student Age

SCCCD: Student Age Distribution



Fresno City College: Student Age Distribution



Reedley College: Student Age Distribution



North Centers Combined: Student Age Distribution



Willow International/Clovis Center: Student Age Distribution



Madera Center: Student Age Distribution




Student Gender

Gender by campus is illustrated in **Figures I.29 - I.35**. No major changes have occurred in the division of student gender (**Figure I.29**). Madera serves the greatest percentage of females at an average 68%; Oakhurst is a close second at 67% average female population (**Figure I.34-I.35**). Fresno City College serves the greatest percentage of males at an average 47% (**Figure I.30**).

SCCCD: Student Gender



Fresno City College: Student Gender



Reedley College: Student Gender



North Centers Combined: Student Gender



Willow International/Clovis Center: Student Gender



Madera Center: Student Gender




Student Load

Figures I.36-I.42 exhibit student load. The breakout of full-time and part-time status districtwide has remained consistent over that past 5 years (Figure I.36). SCCDD: Student Load



Fresno City College: Student Load



Reedley College: Student Load



North Centers Combined: Student Load



Willow International/Clovis Center: Student Load



Madera Center: Student Load










Transfers to the CSU and UC Systems by Ethnicity 2008-2009





Tables 1 through 5 show the 70 percent LLSIL and the poverty guidelines for western metropolitan and nonmetropolitan areas, and for three specific Metropolitan Statistical Areas in California. In addition, each LLSIL table includes the 100 percent LLSIL that establishes the Department of Labor's minimum self-sufficiency levels. Each table specifies which areas encompass which Local Workforce Investment Area (LWIA). For a family of one, in all tables, the poverty guidelines exceed the 70 percent LLSIL and, therefore, should be used to establish the low-income status. For all other family sizes, the LLSILs exceed the poverty guidelines. The last column in each table shows the amount to be added to the figure for a family of six for each additional family member.
