2. Presentation and discussion of draft Vision: RC subcommittee	Reviewed draft Vision statement	Recommendation was made to change “cultivate” to “develop”; however, many in the group liked cultivate and it’s link to agriculture.
3. Presentation and discussion of draft Mission: FCC subcommittee	<p>Draft Mission Statement – the group met today and discussed many topics. Themes that were discussed to include were accountability, accessibility, diverse community, workforce needs. Comment was made that students aren’t provided information about the other campuses in our district when they are deciding the goals – the district needs to better market programs and let students know about signature programs at the other campuses/centers.</p> <p>The group also reviewed themes from the Charrette.</p> <p>We need to consider how to serve students that may not be traditional students but who are still coming to our door in these budget times.</p> <p>Determine the target audience – need to be sure to include those who are part of our mission, but may not be the traditional student.</p> <p>Incorporation of adult education into the community college – look at models from San Diego and San Francisco.</p>	Draft will be created and sent to the group.
