

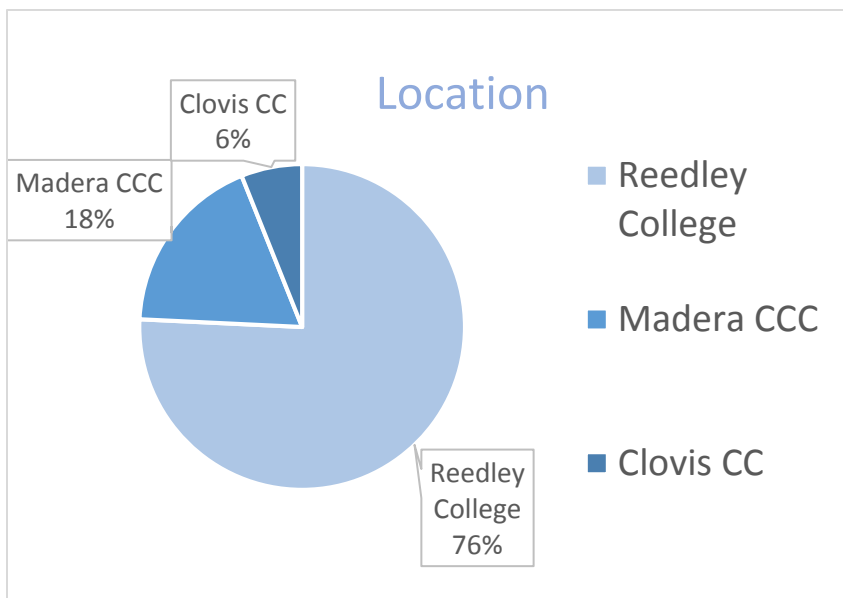


Cultural Competency Summit 2016

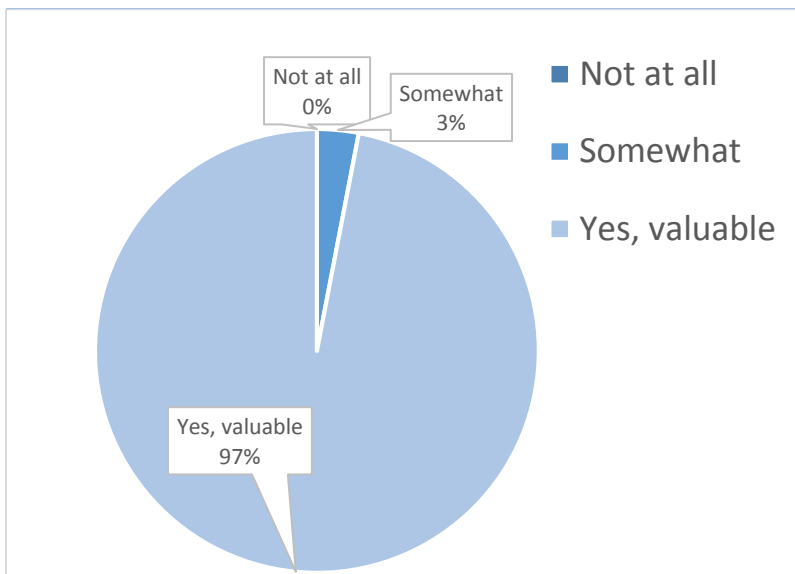

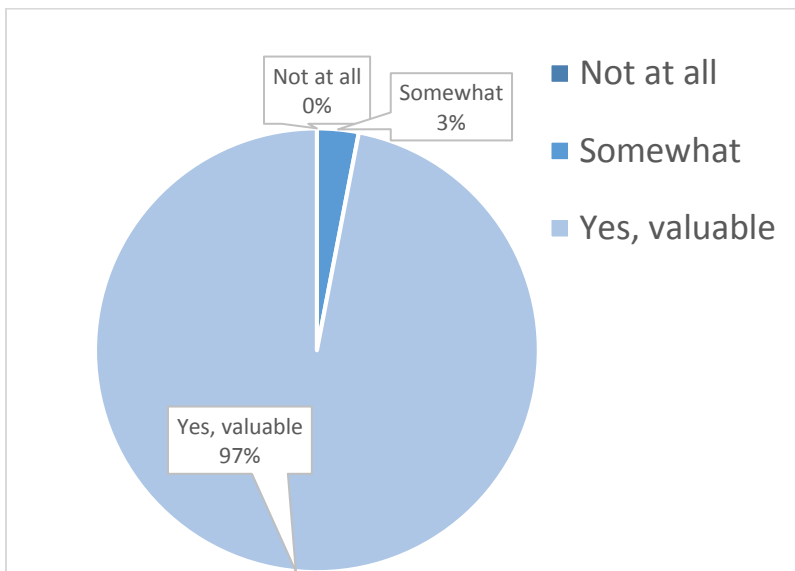
In reference to the keynote speaker, "Did you find the information valuable?"

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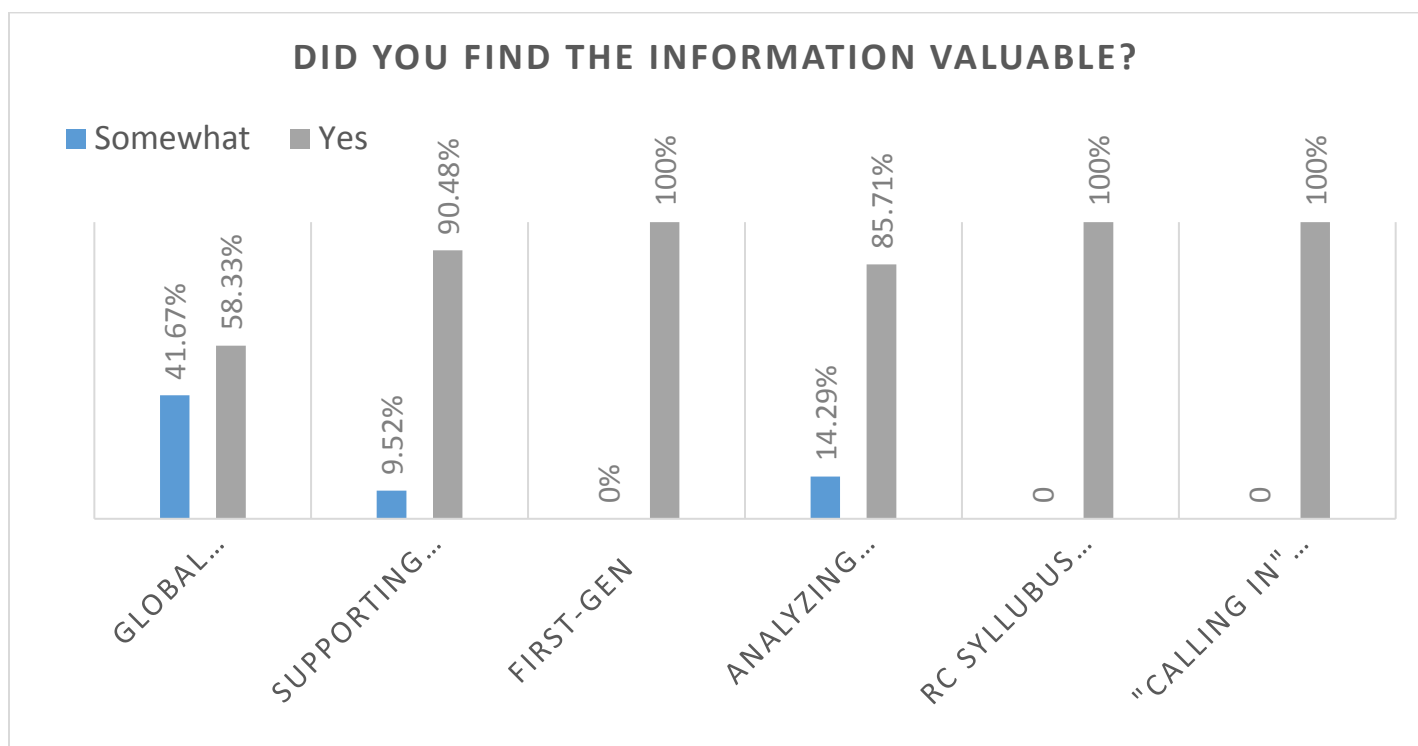

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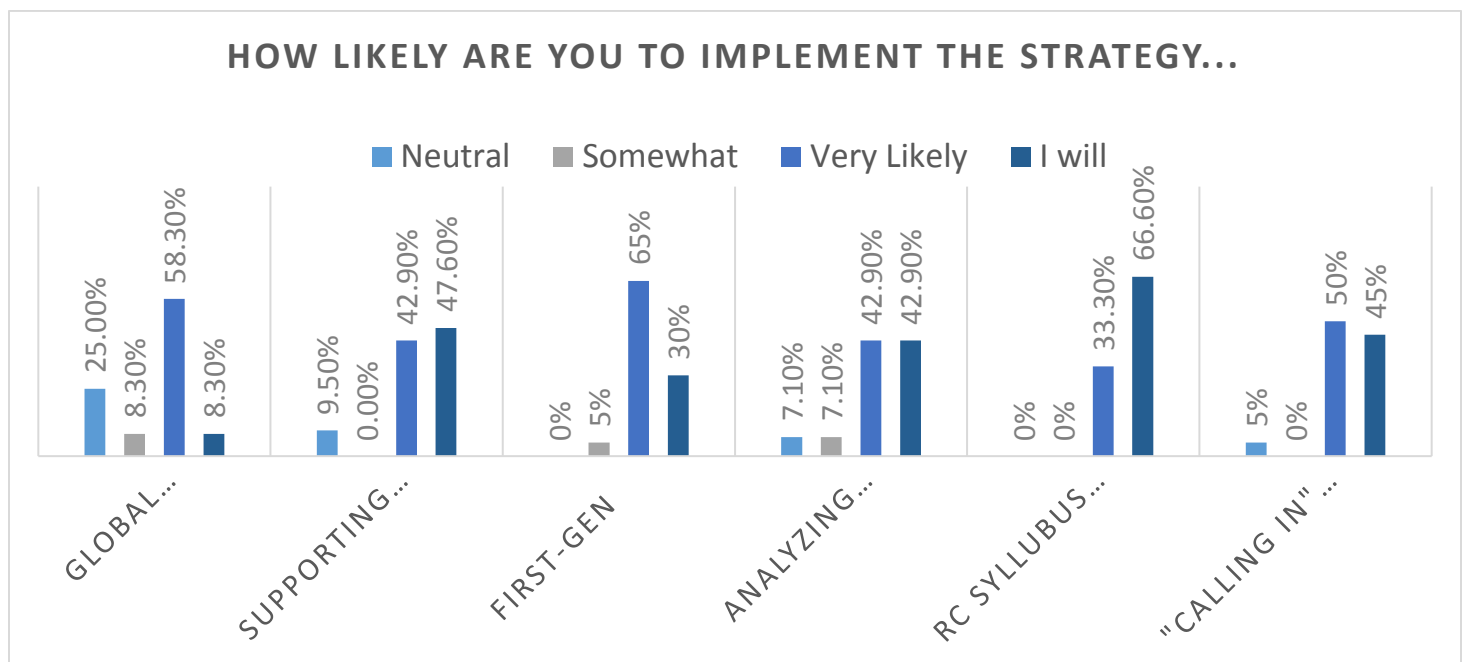
