## This meeting was an orientation/"first steps" meeting

- I. Review of *ad hoc* committee charge as stated in MO Faculty Association Resolution SP16-01, which was endorsed by both the Reedley College Academic Senate and the Reedley College Council
  - A. BE IT RESOLVED that the Madera-Oakhurst Faculty Association supports the formation of an ad hoc committee to assess and evaluate the committee and governance structures the of Madera Community College Center, and produce a recommended addendum to be added to the Reedley College Participatory Governance Handbook that addresses our local "committees of the campus."
- II. Discussion of proposed steps to meet the *ad hoc* committee charge
  - A. Review the Reedley College Participatory Governance Handbook
    - 1. Confirm accuracy of committee structure as stated in the *Handbook*
    - 2. Confirm accuracy of committee compositions as stated in the *Handbook*
  - B. Consider the role of the College Center Council in the overall Reedley College governance structure and recommend a committee operating agreement for College Center Council to the appropriate constituencies
  - C. Interview individuals from recently established community colleges in California (e.g., Clovis, Norco, Moreno Valley, West Hills-Lemoore) as to their experiences in establishing committees and governance structures within an existing college, while having an eye toward becoming an independent college.
  - D. Recommend a committee structure for Madera and Oakhurst to all appropriate constituency groups.
- III. Discussion of *ad hoc* committee composition
  - A. It was agreed that the following persons/groups should be asked to serve
    - 1. President, Madera-Oakhurst Faculty Association (or designee)
    - 2. President, Associated Student Government (or designee)
    - 3. Classified Senate
    - 4. Academic Senate
    - 5. Administrative Services (perhaps an accounting technician?)
    - 6. Instructional faculty
    - 7. Student support faculty
  - B. The question of the appropriate appointing body for classified staff—CSEA or Classified Senate—was discussed. Dr. Caldwell explained that since this was not a "governance committee" itself, the Classified Senate could be identified as the appointing body.
