Conference organizers received 228 proposals from across California and selected 86. The title of his proposal is, "Dubstep or Didgeridoo: The Implications of Streaming Applications on Musical Enjoyment." Many strong proposals were submitted by RC Honors students thanks to the work of Dr. John Heathcote. The conference takes place Saturday, May 6. RC Honors students will attend the conference to support Joaquin, learn from the other student presenters, and participate in a campus tour, and admissions workshops.

RC IT Department featured in IBM article

The Reedley College Information Technology (IT) Program is featured in the April 2017 edition of the IBM corporate newsletter. The article outlines the *high employment* rate of RC IT students following their participation with the IBM Power Systems Academic Initiative (PSAI).

According to David Atencio, IT instructor, Reedley College is one of a few American based campuses who use the IBM training platform. The program has "evolved to include Red Hat Linux based instruction (the server system that includes 80% of the world's servers), which includes, CC+, Java, pearl and other programming languages, as well as providing a test platform for students here to learn on real machines, the art of Cyber security, and ethical hacking.

RC Men's Golf secures Conference Championship

The Reedley College Men's Golf team secured the Central Valley Conference Championship on Monday, March 20 at Kings River Golf & Country Club with their 7th straight tournament victory. Having now clinched the CVC Title for 2017, the RC Men's Golf Team has won conference championships in six of the last seven seasons (2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017). Leading the way for the Tigers was Ben Kinsley, shooting a tournament medalist round of 1 over par 73. Israel Garcia and Greg Smith each shot 74's, and were tied for 2nd place with the next best scores on the day! Jace Merlo shot a 78, and Amardeep Manku shot a 79 to round out the scoring for the Tigers. Reedley shot a team score of 378, 14 shots ahead of Fresno City College's 392. West Hills-Lemoore posted a 442, and Taft College was not eligible to post a team score because they only had four players. Lastly, RC has the top four players in the Individual Conference Standings as well, with Israel Garcia just ahead of Ben Kinsley, followed by Greg Smith and Jace Merlo.

RC Men's Tennis clinches League Championship

Tuesday, March 14, the Reedley College Men's Tennis team was successful on the courts against the Modesto Junior College (MJC) Pirates. The Reedley College men clinched the Big 8 "South" Conference Championship. The Tigers started off with a quick win with 3rd doubles team, Gabriel Tovar, and Roberto Torres. At one and two doubles, things started to turn for the Tigers as the MJC men started to play well at the net. The Tigers ended up being down 2-1 after the doubles matches. To win the title, the Tigers had to be victorious in at least four of six singles matches. Reedley College six singles players, Luis Montoya, came out strong to tie with MJC, 2-2. Reedley College three singles, Robert Smith, fought hard with a 7-6, 6-4 win to give the Tigers a 3-2 lead. Singles players, Gabriel Tovar and Ethan Gunn played strong winning in straight sets at 4 and 5 to clinch the match for the Big 8 Conference Title. James Garcia, Reedley College's number two singles player, fought hard to win a close 3-set match. The Tigers number one singles, Aaron Reimer, was the last on the court in a tough three-set battle losing 5-10 in the super tie-breaker. The Tigers now have a 6-2 record and are 5-0 in the conference. Next for the Tigers will be the Big 8 South Conference Individual Tournament the first weekend of April and the team NorCal Playoffs on Tuesday, April 11.
