Notes: Courses marked (Fall) and (Spring) are <u>usually</u> only offered that semester.

Prior to admissions to the program, the applicant must:

- Hold or be eligible to receive a bachelor's degree prior to admission.
- Receive a grade of "C" or better in each prerequisite course and maintain a minimum cumulative prerequisite GPA of 3.0.
- An overall GPA of 2.5 (3.0 recommended) on the last 60 units completed is also required. CR/NC grades, correspondence courses, or independent study courses cannot be used for prerequisite requirements.
- Employment, volunteer work, or observation in a physical therapy department for a minimum of 100 hours under the supervision of a licensed physical therapist. Fifty (50) hours must be in general in-patient care setting; 50 hours may be in a special area of practice.
- The Bachelor of Science Degree in Physical Therapy was discontinued effective Fall 1997. All students seeking eligibility for admission consideration to the Master of Physical Therapy for Fall 1997 and thereafter must complete a baccalaureate degree in another field and have met all Physical Therapy prerequisites.
- Additional prerequisites are required; however, they are at the upper division level and cannot be taken at a community college.
- Submit GRE (Graduate Records Examination) scores by the end of the fall semester prior to admission.

## Meeting the admission criteria does not guarantee acceptance into the Master of Physical Therapy program.
