To be eligible to apply to UCSF's Dentistry program, an applicant must complete a minimum of 93 semester units (exclusive of repeated and nontransferable courses) of college work at an accredited institution is a minimum requirement for admission. A minimum of 20 semester units must be completed at a four year institution.

Admission to UCSF School of Dentistry is competitive and is based on the following: applicant's academic record, Dental Admission Test (DAT) scores, letters of recommendation, dental related experiences, and the interview.
