COURSE TITLE:

United States History thru Reconstruction

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course is a survey of the political, social and cultural development of the American people from the earliest human settlement thru Reconstruction.

COURSE OBJECTIVES:

To provide students with an understanding of: 1) basic research methods and interpretations as developed by American analysts 2) the development and constant testing of the ideas and institutions of popular, constitutional self-government since the founding of the first colonies 3) the foundations of ethnic art, music and literature 4) the changing ideas about womanhood and childhood 5) the need to think clearly and critically about the relationship between the past and the present 6) how historians analyze data and create and test interpretations and theories. This will be measured by the students taking and successfully completing several examinations and by writing a paper on some aspect of American history.
