Course Description:

Spanish 1A is an introductory course in understanding, speaking, reading and writing Spanish. This course is designed for students who are transferring to four-year universities with foreign language requirements. It is also useful for students interested in bilingual education or any field which involves speaking Spanish.

Course Goals:

The goal of Spanish 1A is to develop proficiency in Spanish. Students are expected to learn to use Spanish for communication in real, meaningful situations. It is also intended that students develop an understanding for basic grammatical concepts and an appreciation of different Spanish-speaking cultures.

Grades. Requirements, etc:

1. General Requirements:

Students are expected to complete <u>all</u> assignments, and attend <u>all</u> class periods, and take <u>all</u> examinations.

2. Specific Requirements:

Attendance:

This will also show how well the student can write and use proper grammar in Spanish. There may be dictation as well as oral tests. There will be pop quizzes. There will be no make-up tests. If you can not take a test at your regular scheduled hour, be sure to make previous arrangements with the instructor. No late homework will be accepted.
