OBJECTIVES:

Students are expected to obtain a working knowledge of the course content and apply their skills in problem-solving situations utilizing basic arithmetic operations involving whole numbers, fractions, decimals, ratios and proportions, percents, and rational numbers.

ATTENDANCE:

Students are expected to attend all class meetings and to be on time. It is distracting and unfair to fellow students to arrive late or leave early from a class. Two incidences of tardiness and/or leaving class early constitutes one absence.

Assignments will be graded on completeness, neatness, and **effort.** Problems must be written out (except word problems), and all work must be shown in order to receive credit. The **average** of all homework grades will be worth one test grade.
