COURSE OUTLINE

Art 1 (Art Basics) 3 Units 2 Hours Lecture 3 Hours Studio Prerequisite - none grading scale

I. CLASS CONTENTS

This course explores the elements and principles of design as they are used in the visual arts. It is the intent of the instructor to familiarize you with the fundamental uses of design in both the Fine Arts and the Industrial Arts, to appreciate what art is all about.

II. STUDIO ASSIGNMENTS

Each student will be required to purchase art materials necessary to complete assigned projects. The campus bookstore stocks these materials in a kit for your convenience.

III. PROJECTS

Projects will be assigned that deal with the application of the elements of design: line, shape, texture, value, color and form. The principles of design: unity, variety, rhythm, harmony, balance, and emphasis, will be utilized in the creation of these projects.
