Final exams:

Course Description: Advanced individual work under supervision of instructor in a specialized area. May include lettering, commercial art, craft design, jewelry, ceramics, sculpture, printmaking, painting or photography. During the first week of the semester, student enrolling must present appropriate project(s) proposal based on skills learned in other art courses.

1 lecture and 4 lab hours per week - 2 units

2 lecture and 4 lab hours per week - 3 units

Credit will be granted for a maximum of 6 units but work must be done in at least two different specialty areas.

Course Objectives: 1. Student will be able to work on more advanced techniques in his/her medium of choice; more complex problem solving projects such as themes,

2. Students will be able to demonstrate ability to find complex solutions through both convergent and divergent processes.

3. Good communications must be maintained on the part of both instructor and student. The student is responsible for maintaining sketchbooks and notebooks to facilitate the exchange of ideas.

Final grades will be evaluated on sketchbook (10%) and for class participation, and the creativity, quality and craftsmanship of the project(s) 90%.

Late assignments will receive half credit; no work will be accepted more than one week late. Tests not taken due to students' illness must be made up within two days of the students' return to class. The final exam must be taken when scheduled.

Attendance will be taken at each class session. If you arrive late, it is your responsibility to inform the instructor after class so that your absence will be changed to a tardy. Three

tardies constitute an absence. Two weeks consecutive absence invites automatic drop with re-instatement by formal petition only. After any third absence, students are eligible to be dropped. If a student wishes to drop a class, it is his/her responsibility to initiate the action. Punctuality and attendance reflect the student's participation in class.

Please observe the campus code regarding dress (shoes or sandals and shirt worn at all times). No eating, drinking or smoking is allowed in the classrooms. No children or pets will be allowed to "sit in". Ensure that you are enrolled in this class- students not enrolled by the third week of instruction will not be graded.
