DESCRIPTION:

Use and care of firearms, explanation of situations warranting use of firearms; legal and moral provisions and restrictions; policy covering use in performance of duty; safety precautions; nomenclature; dry firing and familiarization firing of both handgun and shotgun.

NEED:

To familiarize students with handguns and shotgun, and with the rules, laws, and regulations concerning the safe and proper use of these weapons.

GRADING: There will be three (3) tests. Each test will cover the information that was presented covering a part of the outline. Each test will amount to 50 points. There will be a midterm test amounting to 250 points, (given prior to the Drop Date). This test will be comprehensive, covering everything since the beginning of the semester. This examination must be passed by a score of no less than 70% in order for the student to be allowed on the firing range. The test may be taken only once.

Attendance and participation in class and at the range is essential and will be a factor in determining final grades. The final examination will be worth 250 points, and will be administered at the range in conjunction with a practical test on weapon use and proficiency.
