GRADING

Grades will be based on quizzes (100 points), a mid-term exam (100 points), and a final examination (300 points).

For students to determine where they stand at any given time, they should total the number of points possible for the tests and/or quizzes they have already taken. This number should then be multiplied by .60 (60%). If the number of points that the student has received equals or is higher than the results, he/she is passing; if not, he/she is failing.

To determine the final grade:
