## English 25 Syllabus

<u>OBJECTIVES:</u> The student will learn to write basic sentence patterns, paragraph structure and essay expansion. The writing process will be stressed, utilizing writing partners for evaluation and editing. Parts of speech, punctuation, spelling and vocabulary expansion will be covered. Writing workshops with word processing and Internet will be utilized. Journal writing will include evaluations of readings, writings, test results, to be handed in every other week.. Portfolios of revised writings will be developed for final grade.

<u>ATTENDANCE:</u> Mandatory! This class is a writing workshop. After 6 unexcused absences, you will be dropped. Three tardies = one absence.

<u>TEXT:</u> Eschholz and Rosa, <u>Themes for Writers</u>
Agee and Kline, <u>The Basic Writer's Book</u>

**GRADING:** A = Student consistently contributes to class discussion, fulfills writing assignments, completes readings, demonstrates superior grasp of basic writing skills, contributes to writing partner's efforts, earns 90-100 on tests, 5 and 6 on holistically scored manuscripts, deadlines met.

B = Student consistently participates in class discussion, scores 80-90% on tests and 4 on holistically scored manuscripts, demonstrates good grasp of basic writing skills, deadlines usually met.

C = Student adequately participates in class, completes most readings, demonstrates fair improvement in writing skills, but still exhibits a need for developmental instruction. Late work is automatically given a C or lower. Scores 70-80% on tests.

D = Student may have language difficulties that require an additional semester in English 25 to prepare him for English 1A. He may be inadequately prepared for class discussion, fail to complete readings, manuscripts on time. Scores 60-70% on tests.

F = Student fails to complete 50% of the assignments, has more than 6 absences, does not participate in evaluation or writing workshop.

<u>Late papers, Missed tests:</u> No makeup tests or late papers unless student has a valid excuse (phoned in to office or instructor's home) for absence. It is the student's responsibility in that case to make arrangements for makeup. Late work will be lowered one grade point.

<u>MATERIALS</u>: Three-ring binder for notes and handouts, spiral notebook for Journal, small stapler, postits, highlighter, pocket dictionary, computer disk (optional but suggested: daily planner, thesaurus, hole punch, plastic sleeve for above items).

<u>REOUIREMENTS:</u> The student of Eng.25 will be required to write a minimum of 5 pages a week, either as Journal entries or composition assignments.
