English 56 is designed to give you practice writing English sentences, paragraphs, and short papers, including work with spelling, vocabulary, punctuation, usage, and sentence structure skills needed by writers. Emphasis will be placed on the communication of the writer's ideas.

You will be required to submit approximately 14 writing assignments and to complete <u>numerous</u> spelling/vocabulary and sentence structure homework assignments. You will also take several quizzes and tests. You must earn a C or better to receive credit for this course.

**Required Materials:** You will need a textbook, a good collegiate dictionary, and, of course, pencil and paper. <u>Always</u> bring your textbook to class.
