### Course Description:

To acquaint students with basic music concepts and terminology. These concepts are then employed in the study of the past eight hundred years of our musical heritage.

### Goals:

To become familiar with general information, background, basic musical elements and historical overview of musical style from its origin to the present. Students will learn to listen to all types of music and be able to recognize the different musical instruments sight and sound.

#### Attendance:

Students are expected to attend each class. After <u>four</u> absences, students will be <u>dropped</u>.

<u>Dropping</u> from this class is <u>YOUR</u> responsibility. Failure to drop could result in a grade being issued (students who exceed the four absence limit after the drop date (3-13) will receive an "F"). Remember to turn in a drop card if you stop attending.

#### Tardy:

If a student is tardy, it is <u>his/her</u> responsibility to notify the instructor immediately after class so that the absence is changed to a tardy. Three tardies constitute an absence. A tardy in excess of 20 minutes is considered an absence.

## Expectations:

Students will be expected to read the chapter materials <u>before</u> the day of <u>lecture</u>, complete and turn in assigned exercises, and be prepared to discuss assigned chapters. Lectures will serve the purpose of clarifying and expanding the reading material.

Students will be expected to define chapter terminology in preparation of weekly quiz.
