Course Description:

Spanish 1A and 1B are an introductory course in understanding, speaking, reading and writing Spanish. This course is designed for students who are transferring to four-year universities with foreign language requirements. It is also useful for students interested in bilingual education or any field which involves speaking Spanish.

Course Goals:

The goal of Spanish 1A and 1B is to develop proficiency in Spanish. Students are expected to learn to use Spanish for communication in real, meaningful situations. It is also intended that students develop an understanding for basic grammatical concepts and an appreciation of different Spanish-speaking cultures.

Course Content:

Spanish 1A and 1B use the same text, Dos Mundos. The grammatical content of each course is as follows:

Spanish 1A: Capítulos Paso A- 6

Major structures presented include the present tense, present progressive, ser vs. estar, stem-changing verbs, reflexive verbs, preterit and pronouns.

Spanish 1B: Capítulos 7-16

Major structures presented include, Tú commands, future tense, conditional, por vs. para, perfect tenses and the subjunctive.

Grades, Requirements, etc:

1. General Requirements:

Students are expected to complete all assignments, and attend all class periods, and take all examinations.
