1. Class Objectives

- A. Recognize and comment on different aspects of visual works such as painting, sculpture, architecture, etc.
- B. Recognize the various design elements which make up all visual works of art.
- C. Identify artists of the past and present and recognize and identify their works.
- D. Relate works of art to their cultural and historical settings.

3. Exams, Quizzes & Assignments

In the first half of the semester there will be one quiz and a mid-term exam. Students will also be required to visit at least one art exhibit per half semester and turn in a paper on each exhibit. In the second half of the semester there will be one more quiz and the final exam.

4. Extra Credit

A 10 to 15 minute presentation on some aspect of art or a presentation of a piece of your own art. agreed upon by the instructor Originality of thought and opinion will be important.

5. Grading

Class participation is a major part of the learning experience. All students must participate in class discussions. Grading will be based on class participation (10 %), art exhibit papers (10 % ea.), quizzes (15 % ea.), and exams (20 % ea.).

6. Various Policies

If you have any unexcused absences, late projects will not be accepted. Regular attendance is very important. After six absences you may be dropped for non-attendance. You will be dropped if you miss two consecutive weeks. Three tardies constitute an absence. If you wish to drop a class it is your responsibility. The ninth week is the deadline for dropping a class with a "W". After the deadline a letter grade will be posted. **Drop Deadline is October 15th**
