COURSE DESCRIPTION:

ESL 61 is a basic course designed to teach speakers of other languages reading skills. Although the acquisition of reading skills is the primary focus of the course, English comprehension skills, speaking skills and writing skills will also be acquired through constant classroom interaction and exercises. The focused communicative approach is used. The student will regularly be given authentic reading materials, discuss the knowledge they have with the subject matter before reading, and then read and analyze the reading materials for content, grammar and vocabulary. The class will also discuss the topics in groups and with the entire class. Students will read a wide selection of materials, some very practical, such as T.V. habits in the United States, to nuclear and extended families in various countries. It is hoped that the student will be able to understand a variety of written media after completing this class, which will help the student in the community as well as prepare the student for more advanced English courses at Reedley College.
