ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Students are expected to attend each class. After six absences, students will be dropped. If a student is tardy, it is his/her responsibility to notify the instructor immediately after class so that the absence is changed to a tardy. Three tardies constitute an absence. TOPICS:

Study of chord progressions in tonal music with an emphasis on 4-part writing. Topics will include: relative and linear motion, voicing, doubling, chord connection, chord functions, modulation. Assignments will include: harmonizing a given soprano line, realizing a figured bass line, creating compositions from a given chord progression, and style analysis of standard repertoire.

Classroom work will include lecture/demonstrations, peer instruction, and student drill at the blackboard. Students should expect daily homework assignments.

One or two Mid-term tests will be given.

LATE ASSIGNMENTS:

Late assignments will receive a maximum of half credit. No credit will be given for assignments that are more than one week late. Late assignments cannot be re-done. Redone assignments will be accepted only until the midterm test is given on that material.

GRADING CRITERIA:
