18 weeks course: Use the structures and principles of ASL, engages in spontaneous conversation using ASL at a level expected for signers, recognize and state the aspects of the culture of the Deaf community, further develop and improve expressive skills in ASL, further develop and improve controlled lectures and conversations.

Course Policies
