* The textbook is optional, but the access to coursecompass is mandatory. The access can be bought online if you do not want the textbook. You have access to the book online with the access code. The access code costs around \$78, and can be purchased online at www.coursecompass.com. The use of a credit card is required if you purchase it online. MAKE SURE YOU SIGN UP FOR THE RIGHT BOOK AND EDITION!!! There is a loose leaf version of the book packaged with the access code that can be bought from the bookstore.

Requirements: A dial-up connection is too slow for this class. The website that the class will be using is www.coursecompass.com [and NOT Blackboard – only the orientation video will be uploaded on Blackboard]. This site only requires that your browser (i.e. internet explorer, netscape, etc.) has specific plug-ins.

Materials Needed:

Graph paper, binder, binder paper, ruler, pencils, erasers, stapler. Scientific calculators (not graphing). Check with the instructor for the use of other calculators.

Course Description:

As stated in the Reedley College course outline, Math 4A is a trigonometry class that involves angles, trigonometric and inverse trigonometric functions, right and oblique triangles, graphs, identities, trigonometric equations, vectors, polar coordinates, De Moivre's Theorem, and applications.

Attendance and Tardy Policy:

- Students who do not attend the mandatory orientation will be dropped.
- Students who do not sign up at www.coursecompass.com by January 17 will be dropped.
- Since this is an online class, students are expected to check their e-mails regularly and work on www.coursecompass.com daily and regularly. That is what attendance is based on. Late work is not accepted. Excuses will not be accepted (for example, I did not read my e-mail, my computer froze,). Students who do not check their emails or work on their assignments on regular basis could be dropped for non-attendance. The attendance policies still hold in an online class. Missing an assignment or not checking email is the equivalent of being absent.
- Students are responsible for any and all information sent to them in emails or posted on the courses site.
- Technology problems will not be accepted as excuses to get extensions, second chances, or exceptions.
- Students are expected to attend the onsite <u>mandatory</u> meetings on the scheduled date (as mentioned in the schedule of courses), arrive on time, bring a valid picture ID, and stay for the whole class period. Students who are absent or late, or who leave early will receive a <u>zero</u> on the missed or late midterm.

Behavioral, Campus, and Academic Policy:

• Reedley College campus policies and academic regulations will be implemented in this class.

<u>Plagiarism</u>: Reedley College rules on plagiarism will be enforced. Students cheating and students allowing others to cheat off of their assignment will receive a 0% on that assignment (whether it is a final, test, quiz, midterm, or any other assigned work). <u>PLEASE NOTE</u>: Scoring 30% higher on the online chapter quizzes, then on the onsite midterm exams is a sign that you got unauthorized help - cheating. **The teacher reserves the right to make that conclusion.** [For example, if a student scores an 80% on the online chapter quiz, but scores a 50% on his midterm which is based on the same material – this might mean that the student got unauthorized help on the online chapter quizzes.]. In that case, the rules on plagiarism/and cheating will be enforced.

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Grading Policy: Students are graded according to the following:

Online homework grades constitute 25% of the student's overall grade.

Online chapter quizzes grades constitute 15% of the student's overall grade.

Onsite Midterm exam grades constitute 45% of the student's overall grade.

Onsite Final Exam grades constitute 15% of the student's overall grade.

- Online Homework: Homework is assigned on regular basis. Homework will not be accepted late. Homework assignments will be given on-line. It is advisable to work a couple of days ahead of the due dates. It is important to stay current to be successful in the course! Do not expect to take the exam and then complete the homework. Each assignment has a due date and the assignment will be unavailable to the student after the due date. The two lowest homework scores will be dropped to allow for emergencies.
- Online chapter quizzes: Online chapter quizzes are to be taken online by the scheduled date/time. They are timed, so pace yourself. Complete the homework first before you take the online quizzes! Some quizzes might have a pre-requisites of completing the homework. The reason is you cannot learn the material in an online class without doing the homework. Your homework score should be comparable to your quiz score. Do not use unauthorized help on your quizzes. It will be very evident that you have done so if your midterm score is much lower.

 Online quizzes will not be accepted late. The lowest online quiz score will be dropped to allow for emergencies.
- Onsite Midterm Exams: Three onsite midterm exams will be administered throughout the semester. No make-up midterm exam will be given for any reason. Students are expected to take the midterm on the date and time scheduled. Student need to present their valid picture ID or Driver's license to be allowed to take the midterm. NO ID= NO MIDTERM. Students who do not take a midterm will receive a score of ZERO on that midterm. THE MIDTERM SCORE CANNOT BE DROPPED. The lowest midterm score may be replaced by 80% of the final exam score.

Students should not take the class if the scheduled dates or times of the midterm exams do not fit in their schedule.

Onsite Final Exam: is a comprehensive final meaning it might contain any of the material covered from the entire semester. NO ID = NO FINAL. The final exam score cannot be replaced by a midterm score. Students who do not take the final will receive a score of 0% on the final. Final exam is administered on Tuesday, May 17, 2011 @ Reedley College – from 6pm to 7:50pm in Room FEM4E [OR Monday, May 16th from 9am-10:50am in CCI 206].

Students should not take the class if the scheduled date or time of the final exam does not fit in their schedule.

If students need further clarification regarding grades, they are welcome to consult the instructor.

• How do I communicate with the instructor in an online class?

Email is the form of communication students must use in this class at all times. Send emails to lina.obeid@reedleycollege.edu. Any other form of communication used will not guarantee a response. The instructor will communicate only with the students enrolled in the class. All communication should be through the enrolled student's scccd.edu email address. Instructors are not checking their emails 24h/7d. Students need to allow between 1 to 2 business days for a response to their email. It is the student's responsibility to work and email in a timely manner.

In order to receive a response to your emails from the instructor, the emails sent must:

- 1) be written clearly and professionally using complete sentences. Text message styles are not considered.

• What would improve my chances of success in this class?

To pass this class you need to have strong math skills, following directions, self-motivation, excellent study skills, and lack of procrastination. A student's procrastination is no one else's emergency.

[For example: If a student begins an assignment the same day it is due and runs into an issue, then that student also runs the risk of not getting help in time. In that case, even if the assignment is incomplete, the student will not be given an extension.]
