There will be no make-ups of missed quizzes or discussion board assignments for any reason, no matter how compelling. Grades There will be two objective tests and four graded papers. Almost every week you will take a quiz and/or a writing exercise covering material on mechanics, sentence structure, essay structure, the use of research materials, and/or the reading. The papers will be judged on the basis of style, organization, content, and the degree to which you have followed the directions for the assignment. No essay seriously deficient in the area of mechanics (spelling, grammar, punctuation) will receive a passing grade. The assignment weights and grade scales are listed below. Plagiarism Use of another's work as though it were your own will not be tolerated. In the current Reedley College Catalog, plagiarism is defined as follows: Plagiarism is a specific form of cheating: the use of another's words or ideas without identifying them as such or giving credit to the source. All other formats will remain ungraded.
