**Course Description:** This course focuses on developing basic skills and terminology associated with using money. Topics covered include coin/currency identification, coin/currency value determination, counting coins/currency and choosing the appropriate coin(s)/currency to pay for a purchase.

In the process of completing this course the student will demonstrate the ability to:

- A. Identify coins, currency and their correlating values.
- B. Count coins & currency correctly.
- C. Choose currency needed to cover the cost of a purchase.
- D. Create an expense worksheet from a template.
