- B. understand the figured bass system and be able to harmonize a given bass line in standard four-voice harmony.
- C. create and correctly notate his/her own composition using standard tonal chord progressions, accurate chord voicing and voice leading.
- D. fully analyze standard tonal musical literature of the 17th, 18th and 19th centuries with respect to harmony, melody, rhythm, texture and form.

ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Students are expected to attend each class. After the equivalent of 2 weeks of absences, students will be dropped. If a student is tardy, it is his/her responsibility to notify the instructor immediately after class so that the absence is changed to a tardy. Three tardies constitute an absence.
