Class Activities This hybrid class will consist of reading assignments, in-class and out-of-class writing assignments, quizzes, tests, discussion activities, and lectures. The degree to which you are successful in this class will be a direct reflection of how seriously you take each of these activities.

Late Papers, I will accept no late papers unless you have contacted me prior to the deadline Missed Exams posted for the assignment. There will be no make-ups of missed quizzes, discussion board assignments, or weekly writes for any reason, no matter how compelling.

Grades There will be two objective tests and four graded papers. Almost every week you will take a quiz and/or a writing exercise covering material on mechanics, sentence structure, essay structure, the use of research materials, and/or the reading. The papers will be judged on the basis of style, organization, content, and the degree to which you have followed the directions for the assignment. No essay seriously deficient in the area of mechanics (spelling, grammar, punctuation) will receive a passing grade.

The assignment weights and grade scales are listed below.

Plagiarism Use of another's work as though it were your own will not be tolerated. In the current Reedley College Catalog, plagiarism is defined as follows:

> Plagiarism is a specific form of cheating: the use of another's words or ideas without identifying them as such or giving credit to the source. Plagiarism may include, but is not limited to, failing to provide complete citations and references for all work that draws on the ideas, words, or work of others, failing to identify the contributors to work done in collaboration, submitting duplicate work to be evaluated in different courses without the knowledge

All other formats will remain ungraded, and I will not accept papers submitted via Google Docs.
