## Course Description

This class is a vocal performance ensemble designed to promote healthy singing habits and explore a variety of choral music both accompanied and unaccompanied.

## Course Content

## Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

1. perform a variety of choral literature representative of different musical styles and eras.

## Objectives:

In the process of completing this course, students will:

1. Develop a series of warm-up techniques.
2. Learn about the composers of the works studied and their placement in the correct historical style periods.
3. Learn the correct pronunciation of texts in foreign languages, and the meaning of the texts in English.
4. Learn choral rehearsal techniques to improve the quality of their performance.
5. Participate in one or more public performances.

## Membership Requirements

Membership in the choral ensembles is an agreement to participate fully in all activities of the choir. In addition to scheduled rehearsal time, students should expect to spend time preparing for rehearsal. Please note the schedule of events in your personal calendar. You are expected to attend all rehearsals and performances during the semester. Failure to participate in a dress rehearsal or final performance may result in a failing grade. All absences for a dress rehearsal or concert must be communicated via email to the director by the drop period Friday, February $1^{\text {st }}$. Excessive absences are not acceptable and can result in dismissal from the ensemble at any time during the semester (see specific Attendance and Grading Policies).

## Attendance and Grading Policies

Ensemble members are expected to be at all rehearsals. Preexisting conflicts with rehearsals or concert dates must be submitted in writing to the conductor no later than Friday, February $1^{\text {st }}$. The nature and frequency of these conflicts will be evaluated to determine participation in the ensemble. Unauthorized absences from dress rehearsals are not permitted and may result in dismissal from the ensemble and a failing grade.

Ensemble members are expected to be prepared for every rehearsal and performance project. Arrive early for rehearsal with all provided scores and a pencil. A consistent lack of musical preparation is not acceptable and will result in a diminished grade for the course. If you arrive after the rehearsal has begun, consult with the conductor immediately following the rehearsal.

Students are allowed two absences over the course of the semester and all absences will be treated equally. If you begin to have attendance problems, communicate with the professor as soon as possible.

## Grades will be calculated according to the following scale:

Attendance: Deducted from Final Grade
Absence \#3 and each subsequent absence will result in the loss of 5\% from your final grade.
Concerts and Dress Rehearsals: 50\%
Performance tests may be included in this score as necessary.
Repertoire and/or Written Quizzes: $50 \%$
Scheduled for at least: Jan $23^{\text {rd }}$, Feb $13^{\text {th }}$, Mar 27 ${ }^{\text {th }}$, Apr $24^{\text {th }}$, and May $20^{\text {th }}$ (Final)
Additional exams and pop quizzes may also occur as necessary.
