Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Describe socialization of the child focusing on the interrelationship of family, school and community.
- 2. Identify the educational, political and socioeconomic impacts on children and families.
- 3. Describe strategies that empower families and encourage family involvement in children's development.

Student Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Identify how the child develops within a system and is influenced by multiple factors of socialization.
- 2. Compare historical and current theoretical frameworks of socialization.
- 3. Describe contemporary social issues and their effects on families and children.
- 4. Compare and contrast diverse family characteristics and parenting styles.
- 5. Evaluate the impact of one's own experiences on their relationships with children, families, and the community.
- 6. Describe legal requirements and ethical responsibilities of professionals working with children and families.
- 7. Identify community resources and strategies that support children and families.

Assignments/Requirements

Assignments may vary weekly. This may include written work, individual and group activities, and quizzes. Students are expected to log on at least two times per week, prepared and ready to discuss reading assignments. Students will also be expected to log in for at least three hours aside from the regular.

- All assignments must be neat and clearly labeled with student name and date.
- Papers should be double-spaced, 12 point font, one inch margins in an easy to read font.
- Always make a copy of your work.
- Late assignments NO late assignments will be accepted. Late assignments will <u>only</u> be accepted in cases of emergency and with Doctor's note for verification. Once late work has been approved, the assignment will drop one letter grade each day it is late. The assignments will need to be turned in by the end of the week it is originally due. Late assignments will only be received via email when approved. Group assignment / activities cannot be made up or turned in late, as they will include group discussions that cannot be duplicated.
- Late work will NOT be accepted. Any assignments not turned in on the assigned due date will be
 considered a late assignment and receive ZERO points. Miss Sanchez will not be accepting
 assignments through email, you must use Canvas to submit your assignments. The socialization
 report may not be turned in late. All assignments are given out well in advance and must be
 submitted on time. If you know you will be unable to turn in your work by the due date, you must
 contact the instructor.
- As an online course, you will be required to read and respond to your classmates.
- This class is online, meaning online time is required. ALL work must be submitted via the class Canvas site. NO work may be turned in directly to the instructor, unless otherwise stated.

Assignments (Weekly assignments will be posted at 7:00am). All assignments are due by from the previous week by Sunday at 11:55pm unless otherwise noted.

- 1. Online Orientation and Ground Rules- read and comment on orientation presentation and ground rules (Orientation 15 points/ Ground Rules 5 points)
- 2. <u>Introduction-</u> A written self-portrait of who you are. At least 1 ½ pages.(25 points)
- 3. Welcome Biography- Meet your classmates (10 points)
- 4. Weekly Check in / Participation- Weekly Check-ins are important to your grade in the course. You are required to check in at the beginning of the week, if you do not check in, you will be marked as absent even if you complete all the work. Check-ins should happen on Monday or Tuesday. Remember, check ins are counted towards attendance. Includes "Count Down" and "Final Thoughts" (75 points)
- 5. <u>Think Back Activity</u> Share your childhood memories and home by recalling details and stories from your own childhood. (25 points)
- 6. <u>Discussion Board Questions</u> Reading the text and handouts provided as well as discussion boards. You are expected to read and respond to others in class. Participation in the discussion groups is essential to your Activities and participation include numerous individual and group assignments given throughout the semester. (70 points)
- 7. <u>Community Resource</u> Research and write a one page report on one community resources that support children and families. (30 points)
- 8. <u>It Takes a Village Activity</u> Work as a group to develop a community using all the elements learned in class. (50 points)
- 9. <u>Journal Article Review</u> Find and review any article pertaining to families and children in the community. This article may be from the newspaper, early childhood publications, web articles, magazines, or text books. Write a FULL one-page summary of the article including if you agree. Attach a copy of the article to your paper. (20 points)
- 10. <u>Two quizzes</u> (40 points each). There will be two content based quizzes during the semester. Quizzes may not be made up unless permission is granted by the instructor prior to the quiz deadline
- 11. <u>Socialization Report</u> Your final exam will be based on a completed socialization report. A seven nine page report and visual presentation (85 points- paper/ 15 points web presentation).
- 12. Extra Credit Option Attendance at an early childhood education workshop/webinar and write a reaction paper. Verification of attendance must accompany paper. ONLY with prior permission from Instructor (10 points maximum)
