ATTENDANCE POLICY:

Classroom work will involve lecture/demonstrating, peer instruction and group drill at the keyboard. Students can expect weekly written assignments that focus on the development of correct musical notation. Theory assignments will be given approximately every 3-4 weeks. One written mid-term exam will be given.
