## TOPICS:

## ASSIGNMENTS:

With the exception of the second and third weeks, Reading, Listening, Web Assignments, Discussion Assignments, and Assessment Quizzes will be given weekly. All assignments will be due by 8 a.m. on each Monday. Late assignments will receive 75% credit. No credit will be given for assignments that are more than one week late. Mid-term tests will be given approximately every 6 weeks.

Concert Reports: Three (3) written reports of concerts of live music are required of all students. The concerts must be approved by the instructor ahead of time to make sure that they are acceptable. They must be college level or professional. Rock, country and gospel concerts will not qualify. The three concert report due dates are as follows:

1. First Concert Report due no later than 5pm on Monday, Feb. 24, 2020.

2. Second Concert Report due no later than 5pm on Monday, April 13, 2020.

3. Third Concert Report due no later than 5pm on Wednesday, May 20, 2020. Concert reports must be submitted no later than one week after the concert has taken place. A written review of an approved video can substitute for one concert report. Approved videos are on reserve in the Reedley College Library. Video reports can only replace <u>ONE</u> of the required Concert Reports.
