Course Objective:

ASL I is the first course in a four-course series. Emphasis will be following these: vocabulary, learning every day basic conversational skills, learning how to use facial expression and body language accordingly, learn classifiers, and learn the important history and culture of Deaf. Being able to come to Deaf community events and make some conversational with others. Students will also learn the difference between written ASL and written English.

Student Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion, the student will be able to: •Engage in one on one conversation and share basic information related to common topics such as family, school, daily routines, and recreation.

•Demonstrate receptive/expressive competencies of targeted lexical and syntactical features of American Sign Language such as sentence types, eye gaze, body orientation, non-manual signals, and classifiers appropriate for beginning ASL learners.

•Students will be able to identify and produce numbers 1-30 in ASL.

•Demonstrate fingerspelled word/number recognition by correctly reading proper names or numbers fingerspelled in one-to-one scenarios with teacher-provided cues (e.g., names, places, money, and time).

•Identify the beliefs, values and attitudes within Deaf Culture and become familiar with the products of the culture.
