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Course Description

This course will explore the issues related to abused, battered, and neglected children, along with the profile of abusers. Reporting laws and professional responsibilities will be identified. Identification, prevention and treatment of abused children and abusers will be covered.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Recognize child abuse indicators and identify responsibilities of mandated reporters
- 2. Describe the dynamics of abusive families and the characteristics of high-risk children
- Apply knowledge and make referrals to various intervention and treatment programs
- 4. Participate effectively in family group conferences

Technology Needs

This is a fully online course. The course requires that students have access to a working technological device and a working wifi connection. Students who anticipate the need for assistance with technology should reach out to the appropriate departments on campus and the course instructor. Students will also need to familiarize

themselves with Canvas, email, and the use of word processing programs, including Word, Google Docs, PowerPoint, and Google Slides.

Text

There will be no assigned textbook for the course. There will be assigned readings pertinent to course content. Readings will be provided in class and copies will be provided on Canvas.

Course Requirements

This is an online course conducted via modules on Canvas. Students must log in each Monday to verify the expectations for the week. Students who do not log on during the week will be considered absent and recorded as such. **Students are expected to review the entire weekly module and engage in all activities prior to the due date.**

Students should make it a habit to check their Reedley College email and Canvas accounts daily. It is advisable that Canvas notifications are set to "daily" in order for students to receive all updates in a timely manner.

Assignments may vary weekly. This may include written work, individual and group activities, and quizzes. Students are expected to login to Canvas each week and participate in online activities. Performance in class is directly related to how much time and effort students put into the class material. Students can expect to spend 3-6 hours a week studying and participating in assignments.

- All assignments must be neat and clearly labeled with student name and date.
- Papers should be double spaced, 12-point font, one-inch margins in an easy to read font.
- Always make a copy of your work. Double-check that assignments were submitted. Canvas records the time of submission and will provide reminders of assignment due dates.
- Late assignments Late assignments will incur a 10% point deduction for each day that it is late. Assignments more than 9 days late will not be accepted. You <u>must</u> notify the instructor of your intent to submit late assignments.

Assignments

- <u>Weekly Participation and Activities</u> Reading assigned readings and handouts provided will help prepare students for online discussions and activities. Activities and participation include numerous individual and group assignments, and reflections given throughout the semester. There are no make-ups for missed in class activities.
- <u>Article Review</u> Students will find and review any article pertaining to families and children in the community about child abuse. This article must be from a reputable source and be from a newspaper, early childhood publication, web article or magazine. You may not use a blog site. Students will write a one-page summary of the article and must attach a copy of the article to the assignment submission.
- 3. <u>Quizzes</u> Quizzes are based on module content, materials provided, speakers, and videos.
- 4. <u>Group Presentation</u> Students will be assigned a group and topic. Groups will research the topic, develop a presentation to share with the class and present in a powerpoint or other modality. A two-page written paper is also required.

 <u>Extra Credit Option</u> – Attendance at an early childhood education workshop/event regarding child abuse and prevention and a written summary/reaction paper. Verification of attendance must accompany the paper. With <u>prior permission</u> from the instructor only. (Maximum 10 points)
