**Course Description**: Basic theories, research concepts and principles of physical, cognitive and psychosocial development at each major stage of life from conception to old age be will be explored. This course is designed to promote critical self-understanding. Students will apply developmental theory to major topics that occur throughout one's lifespan.

# **Course Objectives:**

- A. Identify those variables that lead to typical and atypical development.
- B. Describe the developmental attributes and characteristics of a person at different stages in the lifespan.
- C. Compare and contrast the various theories of lifespan development within a given domain (i.e., cognitive learning).
- D. Analyze research and its application to developmental theory.
- E. Describe the stresses and interdependent relationships of people at various stages of development.

#### **Course Outcomes:**

- A. Understand various stages of lifespan development.
- B. Debate various theories of lifespan development.
- C. Identify areas that are critical for normal development (i.e., attachment theory).
- D. Understand the application of research in various areas of lifespan development.
- E. Work better with parents and children, as key indicators of stress are recognized and the complexities of relationships are understood.

#### **Section 2:**

- – vague interpretation and limited connection to the textbook
- – poor or no interpretation and connection to the textbook

- 5 points for good grammar, spelling, (no more than 3 errors) following format,
- 3 points if more than 4-5 errors, poor grammar and/or presentation
- **0 points** for more than 5 spelling errors, paper not considered college level work
