Course Description, Objectives & Outcomes:

This course is specifically designed to guide students in selecting a college major leading to a career path. It encompasses self-assessments, career exploration (career research), decision-making and goal-setting skills, and success strategies. ADVISORIES: Eligibility for English 1A recommended. (A, CSU)

In the process of completing this course, students will:

- Acquire strategies for seeking information about academic majors and careers
- Connect interests, abilities, personality type and values to academic majors and career pathways
- develop decision-making skills encompassing short- and long-term career goals, and a Comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEPC)
- Identify personal interests, abilities, personality type and values
- Implement real-world career exploration and social network structures, including informational interviewing, networking, and job shadowing
- Learn strategies for self-assessment in relationship to choosing an academic major or career
- Research career pathways utilizing the latest technology resources gathering information including job duties, job requirements/education, salary ranges and job outlook

After successful completion of this course, you will be able to:

- Analyze their specific personality traits, interests and values as they pertain to careers
- Evaluate career options and select a major to reach a self-determined career for a Comprehensive Student Education Plan (SEPC) completed with a State Center Community College District counselor
- Investigate careers based on their self-assessment findings through a career research project

Requirements:

Students will be evaluated on their performance in the areas of participation, course assignments and projects, discussion board, quizzes, and a final (portfolio).

Participation/Attendance:

- As an on-line course, <u>you are responsible</u> for logging-in to your CANVAS account often to obtain course materials to include any announcements, lectures, assignments, and/or schedule changes.
- If you do not complete the Discussion #1: Who are you? by the deadline, you will be counted as a "no show" and will be dropped by the instructor.
- If you have not completed 50% of the assignment in the first two weeks of class, you will be dropped from the course (3 out of 6 assignments in this course by end of module 2).
- Active, on-topic discussion is encouraged online. Your views, opinions, and comments are important to the facilitation of this course. Participation includes thoughtful advance readings of the assignments, contributions to good class dynamics, and participation during online class discussion and activities.
- Discussion Board (Canvas): You will be expected to post and respond on a weekly basis within your success team through the Canvas discussion board online. Questions and/or Case Studies will be presented each week (on Mondays) starting the first week of the class. You will need to post your response BY WED and then respond to at least 1 team member on the discussion board BY SUN. You will receive 15 points (each discussion) for posting and responding (if you only post your response, then you will earn 7.5 points)
 - Attendance will be taken through Discussion board participation; however, points are not given for attendance so this does not factor into your final grade

Course Assignments:

Class activities/homework assignments will be required in this course. These activities are designed to be completed individually or in small groups online. Current assignments include:

- Discussion Board Posting (15 points each) (see above)

- Homework-DUE ON SUNDAYS BY 11:59PM
 - Here are just a few: Update or Upload Profile Pic, Understanding Yourself, Career Profile, Career Assessments, Resume, Cover Letter, Elevator Pitch
- Journals (20 points each)-DUE ON SUNDAYS BY 11:59PM
 - Students will complete <u>6</u> journal entries that will be posted on-line through your Canvas site. Questions and in-depth responses to the entries will be typed.
- Student Educational Plan (100 points)
 - Students will meet with a counselor Lupe George to develop a SEP-C. A <u>copy</u> of this SEP is required. The SEP must be current.
 - If you have a current one, please show it to the instructor for credit

- Career Projects (150 points/each)
 - Students will complete Career Virtual presentation and conduct an Informational Interview.
 - A description & rubric for both assignments will be provided on Canvas

Quizzes (50 points):

There will be 5 online quizzes (10 points/each) on Canvas in this course. The quizzes will be multiple choice and will include information from your online course materials and your readings. They will be announced on a Monday and due on Sunday evening by 11:59pm. These are not timed quizzes and so you can use materials from your class to help you complete them.

There are no make-up quizzes. From the time the quiz (on a Monday) is posted, you will have a week to complete it. If students do not meet this time frame, a zero will be given. Contact the instructor as soon as possible through Canvas messaging regarding any issues.

Final (150 points):

- Students will develop an E-Career Portfolio which will consist of important documents developed in the class (e.g., resume, cover letter, elevator pitch)
 - A description and rubric will be posted on Canvas

- There will be opportunities that arise where you will be able to receive extra credit. You will be notified of these opportunities
 - <u>OPPORTUNITY:</u> Students will receive 10 points for their first visit to see me <u>during the student hours</u>
