

Course Description

The course will study the fundamentals of conducting and score reading; standard patterns and baton techniques. It will include practice with recordings and college ensembles. The course is designed for the music major.

PREREQUISITES: Music 1A. ADVISORIES: English 1A or 1AH and Mathematics 3A or 45.

Course Objectives

In the process of completing this course, students will:

- 1. Learn all basic beat patterns.
- 2. Learn gestures for all basic types of beats.
- 3. Study scores from many different musical eras.
- 4. Develop a notational shorthand for use in score study.
- 5. Develop independence of hands.
- 6. Practice conducting with recordings and live ensembles.



Student Learning Outcomes

Upon successful completion of the course, students will:

1. Demonstrate the ability to conduct a large or small ensemble using correct beat patterns and gestures.
