Policy and Administrative Regulations

The Chancellor's Cabinet develops Administrative Regulations. When Administrative Regulations are discussed in Chancellor's Cabinet, matters that require faculty, staff or student input, as provided in state regulation, are referred to the Communications Council. An independent working group of the Communications Council composed of one member appointed by the classified exclusive representative; one member jointly appointed by the Presidents of the each college's Classified Senate; one member appointed by the Presidents of each college's Academic Senate; one member appointed by the faculty exclusive representative; and the District's General Counsel will review and provide input into the development of polices and regulations. The member jointly appointed by the classified senates may not be from the same work site (Fresno City College, Reedley College or North Centers) as the member appointed by the classified exclusive representative).

Each President or the Vice Chancellor-North Centers will also bring proposed Administrative Regulations to his or her President's or Vice Chancellor's cabinet for discussion and input. After all constituent groups have had opportunity for input, Chancellor's Cabinet will consider the input, revise as appropriate and adopt the Administrative Regulation.

Comments from Communications Council are normally expected after two Council meetings. Comments from President's Cabinet are normally expected after one President's Cabinet meeting. In general, Chancellor's Cabinet will approve a proposed Administrative Regulation within three months.

Proposed revisions or amendments to Administrative Regulations are advanced by constituency groups through members of Chancellor's Cabinet or by members of Chancellor's Cabinet itself for discussion by the Cabinet.
