


Reedley College is a college of the State Center Community College District.

Disabled Students Programs & Services assist students with documented physical, psychological and learning disabilities at Reedley College and the North Centers.

DSP&S Mission

The mission of the Disabled Students Programs & Services (DSP&S) department is to ensure accessibility and promote maximum independence of students with disabilities by providing specialized services, instruction and academic accommodations related to educational pursuits. Students who have temporary or permanent disabilities that affect academic functioning may be eligible for a variety of support services.

All services and accommodations are provided based on academic need related to verified disability and may include:

- Adaptive Computer Equipment
- Alternate Media: Etext/ MP3/Braille
- Sign Language Interpreters
- Learning Disability Assessment
- On-Campus Mobility Assistance
- Notetakers
- Developmental Service Classes
- Accessible Parking
- Test Accommodations

Transition to College Program

The Transition to College (TTC) offers high school students the opportunity to gain an understanding of community college and services for students with disabilities through specialized curriculum. Courses are only offered during the spring semester to high schools within designated college service areas.

Workability III Program

Reedley College's Workability III (WAIII) program is a collaborative project with the California State Department of Rehabilitation providing services to students with disabilities that improve access to vocational experiences. The program focuses on providing direct services to assist participants gain employment.

WAIII vocational training program that may include:

Pre-vocational Services:

Interviewing/job seeking skills, advocacy awareness, career exploration/development, creating a portfolio.

Employability Skills:

Workplace behavior/communication/attitude, appropriate grooming/dress, job expectations, resources/referral.

Employment Development/Placement:

On-the-job training, work experience, job placement.



Student Support Services Program

The Student Support Services (SSS) program provides services to students who aspire to successfully transfer to a four-year university and/or complete an associates degree at Reedley College. SSS is designed to provide enrichment services that will alleviate the educational and social barriers which prevent students with disabilities from succeeding at the postsecondary level. Through the delivery of comprehensive academic, social and personal services; the SSS program will promote and increase the retention and transfer rates of students with disabilities.
