## PLACEMENT TESTING RESULTS FOR ENTERING FRESHMEN 2009-2010

The placement test scores assist students in their course selection when entering Reedley College. For math, the classes are

Math 250 - College Arithmetic, Math 101 - Elementary Algebra, Math - 103 Intermediate Algebra, and transfer level math. For writing, the classes are English 252 - Writing Improvement, English 125- Writing Skills for College, and English 1A - Reading and Composition. For reading, the classes include English 262 - Reading Improvement, English 126 - Reading Skills for College, English 1A - Reading and Composition. Students still need to meet with a counselor who will apply multiple criteria advising for appropriate course placement.


