ACTIVITY 1

Community links to increase college readiness:

K16 Bridge

The program is about building relationships between elementary, secondary, and post-secondary institutions. Through technology, training and ongoing support, the K-12 will become active participants in the transition to higher education. Standards based K-16 Bridge lessons are taught in core classes with the results of the lessons stored in each students' e-portfolio. Parents are given access to information and are made an active participant in the program.

Padres Como Compañeros

This bilingual program will give parents the opportunity to be partners in their child's college future by educating them about the educational process. Workshps for parents may contain: financial aid information, community service projects, homework tips, and salaries and benefits of a college education. This program will also host an annual, "Parents as Partners=Student Success" conference.

ACTIVITY 2

New Centers to Promote Success:

Career Center

A new career center will be developed, in addition, a new career counselor will be dedicated to developing on-campus and outreach strategies to provide information for Reedley College students and partnering K16 Bridge high schools.

Transfer Center

Expansion of the transfer center will allow for an increase in services, accommodate more staff, and serve more students and families needing additional information on the transfer process.



ACTIVITY 3

New programs to improve retention and goal completion:

FAST Track to Success

The Freshman Academic Success Team will focus on continuous contact with students that have transitioned from the K-16 Bridge program, but will be accessible to all Reedley College students. The focus of the program will be assisting students' transition from high school to college. Staff will reach out to students by coordinating visits with FAST Tutors, orientations and online components.

Alianza de Transferencia

This program will focus on connecting Hispanic Reedley College students and their families to student services and education planning tools to make their dreams of transfer a reality. Parents of participating students will be invited to attend bilingual meetings regarding the benefits of attending a baccalaureate institution.

ACTIVITY 4

Strengthening the library's ability to serve Hispanic students:

Library Laptop Loan Program

A laptop lending program will be implemented. Reedley College students may research or write papers, view email, use applications, all in a "one-stopshopping" environment.

Bibliographic Instruction Librarian

A librarian will be dedicated to teach students how to locate needed information quickly and effectively. Topics include: the library's system of organizing material, structure of literature, and research methodologies appropriate to disciplines, and other resources and tools.
