7 Steps to Getting Your Veterans Benefits Started

STEP 1:

Go online to <u>www.reedleycollege.edu</u>, click on "New & Returning Students," then "Veterans Benefits & Services" and then select the Appropriate Chapter to Apply for Veterans Benefits. (i.e., Chapter 30, 31, 33, 35,1606,1607)

STEP 2:

Complete the Reedley College Application (online or at Reedley College).

STEP 3:

Complete the Free Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) online.

STEP 4:

Complete the Reedley College Placement Test (at Reedley College)

STEP 5:

At Reedley College complete the Academic Counseling process and VSEP by following these steps:

- A. Schedule an appointment with a Veterans Counselor (see support contact information) to discuss and select one educational goal; Transfer, Associates Degree, or Certificate Program.
- B. Create, review, and sign Veterans Student Education Plan (VSEP).
- C. Submit completed Reedley College Veterans/Dependent Education Benefits Application Packet with VSEP and Major Sheets to Financial Aid.

STEP 6:


Register for Courses: All Veterans will receive a priority registration date. Students should register for courses on WebAdvisor using the VSEP as a guide. The Department of Veterans Affairs will only pay for courses listed on the VSEP, all other courses must be paid for by the student.

STEP 7:

Continuing Academic Counseling Services: Veteran students are encouraged to continually access academic counseling services (academic/progress probation status, update educational goal/major, modify VSEP, etc.)

Veterans Resource Center (VRC):

Reedley College has established the VRC to service the college's student veterans by offering them the support and assistance needed to successfully transition into the academic and civilian world. The VRC is located in the Student Services building, upstairs next to the Financial Aid Office. The VRC is furnished with a study space, computers with adaptive software, and written materials pertinent to veteran services. Recommended Support Services for Veterans:

HEALTH/PSYCHOLOGICAL SERVICES: Provides students with general health information and psychological support services including free sessions.

EXTENDED OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS AND SERVICES (EOP&S): Provides comprehensive support services and direct financial assistance to students who meet the criteria specified by Title 5 educational.

VETERANS CLUB: Provides a forum created and managed by Veterans to support and address Veteran concerns.

TUTORIAL SERVICES: The Tutorial, Writing, and Math Centers provide free tutoring services to students for most courses offered by the college.
